The Process for Your Teen to Receive a Minnesota Driver's License	
	Attend the 30-hour classroom instruction (\$100.00 fee) paid to the Pillager School. Students can register online at isd116.org under Community Education. * A Blue Card is issued when your student completes the 30-hour course.
	Schedule your teen to take the Minnesota Permit Test. Students will need the <u>Blue Card</u> and be 15 to take the Minnesota Permit Test . Parents will need to schedule a test time for the student at drive.mn.gov
	When the student receives a valid Minnesota Driving Permit, they will need to preregister for Behind the Wheel (BTW) lessons (\$280 fee) online at isd116.org under Community Education. A BTW lesson will then need to be scheduled with Kent Janicke or Chris Berent within 4 weeks. If a lesson is not scheduled within 4 weeks, a lesson will be scheduled for your teen by one of the instructors. BTW lessons are offered year-round.
	Students will need to drive with a parent, legal guardian or licensed driver who is at least 21 years old for 15-20 hours prior to the student's first BTW lesson.
	 Students need to drive with a parent, legal guardian or licensed driver who is at least 21 years old for a total of 50 hours (15 of which need to be at night) OR 40 hours (15 of which need to be at night) IF a parent or legal guardian attends one of our parent classes which are offered in the fall and spring (no fee).
	Students will need 6 hours of BTW training with one of the instructors (3 two-hour lessons). *Additional fees (\$30.00 per lesson) will be added for students who do not show up for their scheduled BTW lessons. If you know your student can not make their scheduled lesson, notify the instructor 48 hours in advance and no additional fees will be applied. Emergencies are an exception.
	Students will receive a White Card when they have successfully completed 6 hours of BTW with an instructor. The White Card can be obtained from Mrs. Bramer in the CTC Center provided all fees (including all make-up class fees) are paid in full.
	Parents can schedule their teen's driving test at the DMV when their teen is 16, has held a valid Minnesota Driving Permit for 6 months, has logged their 50 (or 40) hours of driving time and has obtained their White Card. You will need to Schedule a road test at drive.mn.gov
	If your teen is eligible for a farm permit, contact one of the instructors for more information.
